Asbestos mishap cleanup at Nichols

A water storage tank insulated with asbestos-containing material inadvertently was removed from the basement of Nichols Middle School while a new boiler was being installed, causing the contamination of the school's basement and first floor, school officials said at a District 65 school board meeting Monday night.

By Tuesday, about two weeks after the mishap took place, Evanston Elementary District 65 administrators had been assured by an air quality testing firm that the asbestos fibers released in the accident had been cleaned up and the building at 800 Greenleaf St. was safe.

"We could have school today," District 65 Supt. Robert Campbell said Tuesday.

"I hope nobody will make another mistake and I'm sure they won't," Campbell said, adding, "There really is no danger."

NEW HEATING SYSTEM boilers are being installed this summer at both Nichols and Oakton Elementary School, 406 Ridge Av., by Independent Mechanical Industries, Chicago. The water storage tank was removed from the building late last month by an employee of a subcontractor hired by Independent Mechanical, according to District 65 Business Mgr. Leon Eich.
